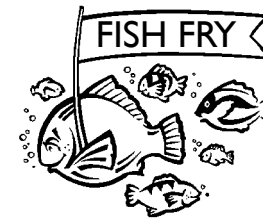

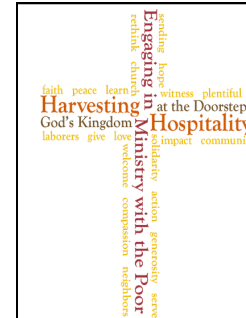


Vacation Bible School is almost here! Come see why God

and diagnosis.
