October Mission Box Project

The October Mission Box Project is the Western Africa Vocational School (WAVS, formerly known as FLAME). In 2000, Esther Miles' sister, Martha Reynolds, and her husband Herb, asked the people of Guinea-Bissau, "If we were to start a school here, what would you want to learn?" People wanted to learn auto mechanics and sewing most of all. WAVS, was started. It was incorporated as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in 2000. In 2003, the foundation for the school was laid. The Reynolds have returned every year since, staying from 3-6 months at a time. There are now 4 computer classes with 15

students each, 19 in the sewing classes and another 19 in the auto mechanics class. New classes in English are underway. In addition, Martha administers first aid to many people, among which are children, who come to her door. Relationships are built in that way. There are now several children named Martha and at least 3 named Herb in Canchungo. At Christmas time, WAVS gives out toothbrushes and toothpaste to a multitude of children. WAVS sends a variety of seed to Bissau each year and they are trucked to Canchungo. Now that the locals are growing not only cabbage but also many other vegetables, there is much more variety in the markets.

Now the local people save the seeds for replanting, so seeds have been replaced by computers in the shipping container. The latest addition to WAVS is an internet café. Such a facility was known previously only in the capital city of Bissau. Two new classrooms have been built and are ready for use this month. Solar panels provide the electricity for the sewing machines, computers and auto mechanics tools, as well as lighting for the classrooms. The ongoing financial need is for money to pay the salaries of the teachers. Loose change in the offering plates and monies in the mission box this month will go to support WAVS. Thank you for your support. It is very much appreciated.

First UMC Community Garden

The gardening season has come to an end now that our irrigation finished up on September 30th. We had a big week of harvesting the third week of September, bringing a donation to St. Annes and a 98 pound donation to the Joyce Hansen Hall Food Pantry plus to all of you on Sunday.

There are still some winter squash to harvest and the kale and swiss chard will probably last until the frost. So now it is time to clean out the garden and till it up. Thanks for your donations to our jar on Sundays; we have \$70 plus dollars to put towards next season's seeds and

plants. We feel blessed to have been involved in this outreach, getting nutritious food to those most in need. Please consider taking part in this project next year because many hands do make light work!

Cookbooks Coming Soon!!

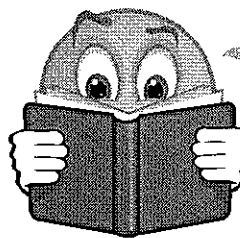

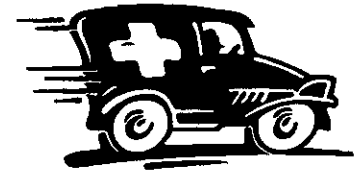

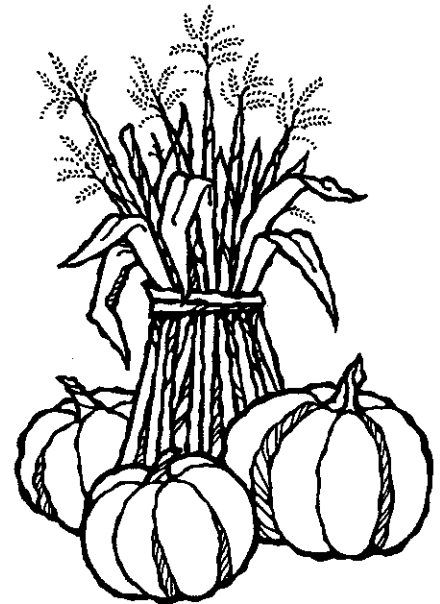

memorial service at 8:30 AM on Sunday, November 6. Bring a picture or special object to represent your loved one. We will name the saints, share stories, prayers, song and communion.

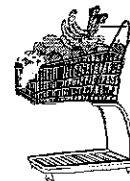

World Communion Sunday, celebrated on October 2, is one of the six churchwide Special Sundays of The United

Methodist Church. World Communion Sunday provides scholarships for U.S. racial- and ethnic-minority students and international students, on both undergraduate and graduate levels.

Recent statistics for The United Methodist Church show the majority of clergy (89.2%) are White, and figures for laity are

similar (86.8%). Yet the U.S. Census paints a somewhat different picture, classifying 80.1 percent of the U.S. population as White. As U.S. demographics continue to change, the church must prepare leaders to serve an increasingly diverse population, and the scholarships funded by the World Communion Sunday nurture new leaders for church and society.

Crusade Scholar Jean-Michel Basquin studied at South Dakota State University. Equipped with a doctorate in rural sociology, his goal is to help the Methodist Church of his native Haiti "to shape a better future for the country."

Reflecting on his scholarship, he said, "I can't be thankful enough. That scholarship is exactly what the church needs to fulfill its global mission. It empowers people so they can empower others."

Half of the offering provides Crusade Scholarships for international and U.S. racial- and ethnic-minority graduate students. Thirty-five percent of the receipts support Ethnic Scholarships for undergraduate students. Fifteen percent funds Ethnic In-Service Training Program scholarships for racial- and ethnic-minority persons seeking second careers in church-related vocations. Please give generously!

Operation Christmas Child (OCC)

The United Methodist Women invite the congregation to participate in this gospel ministry for children around the world who suffer from war, poverty, disease and natural disaster. Since 1993, OCC has delivered gift filled shoeboxes to over 85 million children in 130 countries. A story book, in their native language, about God's love for them is also placed in each box.

You can support this mission project by: (1) filling a standard size shoe box with

small gifts (2) contributing items to be used in filling a shoebox or (3) writing a check made out to **Samaritan's Purse** to help pay shipping and handling costs. Get the whole family involved – watch for items on sale. It's fun and surprising how much you can get in a shoebox. Suggested items are small toys that do not require batteries, hygiene items, school supplies, hard candy, socks, T-shirts, etc. and you can even include a note to the child and perhaps a photo of you and

your family. Please do not include used, glass or liquid items or candy that can melt.

We collected 106 boxes during our last campaign and our goal was 50 boxes. Our goal this year is 100 boxes. Let's see what our God can do this year!! Brochures and boxes are available in the back of the sanctuary. Please bring your filled boxes, loose items or checks to the church not later than November 13.

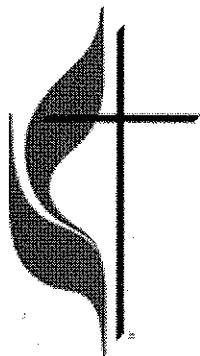
